Purpose


- The purpose of the federal Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) is to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from the transportation network through the development of State carbon reduction strategies and by funding projects designed to reduce on road transportation emissions.
- New funding program through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) for FFY 2022-2026.

Transportation Emissions Reduction Strategy (TERS)


- States were required to develop a Carbon Reduction Strategy (CRS).
- Strategy was due November 15, 2023, and is referred to as the TERS in Kansas.
- The TERS identifies goals and strategies that support the reduction of transportation related emissions.
- KDOT's TERS was approved by FHWA in February 2024.

Available Funding

- Kansas will receive approximately \$12.5 million per year for FFY 2022-2026.
- 65% allocated to areas of the state by population per year
 - Large MPO (KC and Wichita) regions
 - Small MPO regions (Flint Hills MPO)
 - areas >5,000 but <49,999
 - areas <5,000.
- 35% of the funds are flexible and available statewide

MPO Call for Projects

- Small MPOs are conducting a competitive region wide process
- Projects selected and amended in TIP for inclusion in the November 2024 STIP (or earlier).
- Focus on "Ready to go", easy to implement projects
- Projects must be obligated by end of FFY 2025
- Projects that support your region's MTP
- Projects that help implement the KDOT TERS



- Eligible Project
 Sponsors: Cities, Counties,
 Transit Agencies, Tribal
 Nations, MPOs, NonProfits, School/School
 Districts
- Local Match Required:20% local cash match
- Eligible Project Phases:
 PE, Construction and
 Construction Engineering.

- Allowable costs for electric vehicle (EV) charging equipment differ.
- Projects will be administered by KDOT or the Federal Transit Administration, depending on the project type
- LPA Process applies for project development

Eligible Projects

- Federal CRP funding may be used on a wide range of projects that support the reduction of transportation emissions including, but not limited to:
- Energy-efficient street lighting and traffic control devices
- Infrastructure-based Intelligent Transportation Systems
- Alternative fuel projects, including public EV charging, hydrogen, natural gas and propane fueling and zero-emission equipment.
- Bike, pedestrian, and non-motorized facilities and micro-mobility projects
- Traffic monitoring, management, and control facilities

As part of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IJJA)/Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) signed into law in November 2021, the U.S. Department of Transportation established the Carbon Reduction Program (CRP). Following this legislation, KDOT has developed their Transportation Emissions Reduction Strategy (TERS). The MPO Call for Projects is the next step in implementing the goals and strategies of the Transportation Emissions Reduction Strategy. Projects submitted should align with the TERS and be

consistent with the MPO's Connect 2040 plan goals and other local plans.
